51. BADGERS

What?

- Badgers are short, stout, powerful animals with the characteristic black and white striped face.
- They are nocturnal and live in underground 'setts' that can extend well over 50 metres! A badger sett entrance is usually D-shaped and around 30cm in diameter.
- There may be freshly excavated material at the entrance to a sett or piles of vegetation which the badgers use as bedding.
- There may also be evidence of badger latrines nearby.



Why?

Badgers and their setts are protected under the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 and the Protection of Badgers Act 1992. In England and Wales it is an offence to:

- Willfully kill, injure or take a badger or attempt to do so
- Cruelly ill-treat a badger
- Dig for a badger
- Intentionally or recklessly damage or destroy a badger sett, or obstruct access to it
- Cause a dog to enter a badger sett
- Disturb a badger when it is occupying a sett

tt 1981 ice to:

Do **√**

- Immediately stop work and report any badger sett found on the site where you are working or close to the site boundary
- Seek guidance from a competent person before doing any work within 30 metres of a badger sett



Don't X

Don't carry out any works that are likely to disturb, damage or destroy a badger sett
