

Countryside Activities programme



Open Country, a Yorkshire-based charity, helps people with disabilities access and enjoy the countryside. Welcome to our activities programme for January to March.

We run four weekly groups for adults with learning disabilities or autism. Groups run from 10:00am - 4:00pm Tuesday to Friday from Thornes Park Nursery, WF2 8QE. These are chargeable day services.

NATURE FORCE

Tuesdays 10:00am - 4:00pm

The Nature Force group carries out conservation work to improve green-spaces for people & wildlife in Wakefield and beyond.

TRAILBLAZERS

Wednesdays 10:00am - 4:00pm

Our Trailblazer group carry out a range of habitat management and path improvement work to help local people access and enjoy the countryside.



WILD WALKERS

Thursdays 10:00am - 4:00pm

A gentle walk between 4 - 7 miles around Wakefield and the surrounding countryside with plenty of pauses to watch wildlife and admire the views. Each new season brings something magical!

WILDTHINGS

Fridays 10:00am - 4:00pm

This group grow wildflowers, build nest boxes, explore nature reserves and get crafty with nature based activities.

WEEKEND OUTINGS & ADVENTURE CLUB

Open first to anyone with a physical disability or sensory impairment, the outings visit a wide variety of wheelchair accessible locations.

There's a £10 booking fee for the trips and we have a wheelchair accessible minibus to get you there.

Join the minibus from Thornes Park, Wakefield bus station or Wakefield Westgate train station. We can arrange to pick people up from home - but it may depend on where you live and where we're going.

We've tried to choose destinations with accessible toilets and a café, but please bring a packed lunch and a flask just in case the café is closed.

Cancellations make it difficult for us to fill the bus & cover our transport costs. Any cancellation within 72 hours of the event will be charged. Please save the date once you've booked on to a trip.

SWINTON LOCK CANAL BOAT TRIP

STARLING MURMURATION, POTTERIC CARR NATURE RESERVE

BRODSWORTH HALL & GARDENS

Saturday 21st March

Brodsworth Hall was built between 1861 and 1863. It survives as a mid-Victorian vision of a comfortable country house, with many of its original furnishings and the formal gardens laid out around it.



BEYOND THE VISUAL, HENRY MOORE INSTITUTE

An exhibition which demonstrates that blindness is no barrier to creating ambitious, provocative and internationally significant sculpture. Incorporating touch, sound, smell and movement, the works are playful, poetic and often deeply thought-provoking, inviting visitors to encounter sculpture in ways that reach far beyond the visual.

MAM TOR

Saturday 28th March

A 5-mile circular walk around Mam Tor, the "Shivering Mountain" an iconic 517m hill in the Peak District near Castleton, Derbyshire, famous for its stunning views. Some steps and steep sections, so sturdy walking boots and warm, waterproof kit required.
